



NO MEN IN WOMEN'S BATHROOMS

Go to the last page of the ballot and vote **NO** on Houston's Proposition 1. This is not about 'equal rights.' Opposition to Proposition 1 is about protecting women's and girls' privacy and safety in public accommodations.

If passed, Houston's Proposition 1, the so called 'equal rights' ordinance which is the 'Bathroom Ordinance,' would allow troubled men and sexual predators, who claim to be women, to enter women's public accommodations, including bathrooms and showers. You are probably not aware that there are 8,345 registered, convicted sexual predators in Harris County. That only scratches the surface.

It would also allow boys to share shower and locker room facilities with girls in the schools, just as it has happened in California and in other states and cities.

Have you been thinking that it is ridiculous that we are even having to debate this? Are there really people who think that it's a good idea for men to be able to use women's public accommodations?

Wouldn't you agree that men should not be allowed to use women's public bathrooms, showers or locker rooms just because they say that they 'feel' like a

woman? Feelings do not change the facts. A man who says that he is a 'transgender female' is still a man, no matter what he thinks he is. A man dressed as a woman is a man who is engaging in deviant behavior.

I am not going to tell you that Proposition 1 appears to discriminate against women by forcing them to potentially be exposed to perverted men who want to invade their privacy and who may even be planning to harm them. You can decide that for yourself.

Wouldn't you agree that it is prudent for society to maintain separate men and women's bathrooms, showers and locker rooms in order to prevent women and girls from being placed in situations where assaults could happen? Experience shows that it is better to prevent a crime before it occurs.

Go to the last page of the ballot and vote **NO on Proposition 1. "NO Men in Women's Bathrooms. NO Boys in Girls' Showers or Locker Rooms."**
